- Special entry may be granted to an applicant with the approval of the Head of School.



Graduates will be capable of leading practice at an advanced level with the capability to work with diversity, be effective leaders of interprofessional teams for the provision of quality services.

PROGRAMME INFORMATION

The Master of Professional Practice is a 180 credit, Level 9 qualification. You can choose to complete via one of three pathways: a thesis, professional practice project, or a research project. A 'B' grade or above in Research Methods for Health and Social Practice is required to progress into the 90 credit Thesis.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Domestic: Bachelor's degree or equivalent with a B grade average at Level 7, and evidence of relevant practice in a related professional field.
- International: IELTS of 6.5 with no band below 6.
- Special entry may be granted to an applicant who does not meet all entry criteria; provided the Head of School is satisfied the applicant is capable of undertaking the programme of study.


The Master of Professional Practice may be completed with an optional endorsement in either education or leadership.

LEVEL 9

Praxis Research Project

45 credits

Apply skills acquired during the study programme to solve a problem or problems. Learn how to plan, execute, and complete a research project by demonstrating advanced knowledge in a field of professional practice.

Thesis

Learn how to plan, execute and complete an original research project in the form of a thesis by demonstrating advanced knowledge in a field of professional practice.

Professional Practice Project

60 Credits

Learn how to plan, execute and complete a project in the workplace demonstrating advanced knowledge, evidenced based practice and leadership skills in a field of professional practice.

LEVEL 8

Advancing Professional Practice

30 credits

Engage in professional dialogue in an interprofessional environment to analyse the theoretical constructs of professionalism, and provide evidence based solutions and strategies for working in complex contemporary work and service delivery environments.

Clinical Topic

15 credits

Develop an advanced understanding of specialist clinical practice and related issues. Demonstrate praxis by articulating the relationships between theory and clinical, including ethical considerations.

Diversity in Professional Practice

30 credits

Explore cultural, individual, family, community diversity in New Zealand, from a professional practice perspective. This course explores the theory and practice of inclusion at organisational, managerial, leadership, team work group levels, supervision and consultation.

Professional Education Practice

30 credits

Examine your learning and teaching practice against contemporary theory and pedagogy, with a focus on the interprofessional context. Demonstrate capability and leadership in education practice, utilising contemporary pedagogy and an understanding of working with diversity.

Professional Leadership Practice

Examine your skills, knowledge and practice and the ability to lead self and others in professional, interprofessional and organisational settings. Demonstrate capability in leadership in the professional context based on contemporary theory and practice.

Research Methods for Health and Social Practice

30 credits

Explore the theoretical foundations of knowledge and research within the context of your professional practice. This course is designed to provide a practical experience of designing a research project in preparation for a Masters thesis or research project.

Simulation Practice

15 credits

Examine contemporary evidence based approaches to simulation and its use in professional practice, including clinical education. Explore the pedagogy of simulation practice and strategies for its use in an interprofessional environment.

Special Topic I

15 credits

Advance your praxis in relation to a particular area of professional interest. Critically examine a chosen topic, draw conclusions and disseminate findings.

Special Topic II

30 credits

Examine a particular topic or issue related to your professional practice. Analyse the topic, including the socio-political environment, diversity, and interprofessional practice using current research, and disseminate findings in a professional forum.

PROGRAMME INFORMATION

Mental Health and Addiction Strand (including change of scope of practice)

This programme is offered to registered nurses in their first year of practice in mental health and addiction settings or registered general or psychopeadic nurses wanting to change their scope of practice to include mental health nursing. Te Pou funding is available for nurses employed in a Ministry of Health funded mental health service for a minimum of 0.7 FTE per week.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Domestic: Registered Nurse with a current New Zealand practising certificate, Bachelor Degree (or equivalent), currently employed in a relevant clinical setting. Change of scope strand only: nurses must have approval from Nursing Council of New Zealand to undertake this study.
- International: IELTS 7.0 in each band.

PROGRAMME INFORMATION

This programme consists of two courses: Praxis in the Community Setting (Tamariki Ora / Well Child) and Primary Health Promotion. Blended learning approaches are used.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Domestic: Registered nurse with current New Zealand practising certificate, Bachelor Degree or equivalent; and relevant clinical employment for a minimum of two days (15 hrs) per week.
- International: IELTS 7.0 in each band.

HSC8504: Praxis in the Community Setting (Tamariki Ora / Well Child) This course enables you to gain increased knowledge through praxis (the application of theory and research knowledge by reflective practice) and the demonstration of nursing competencies in Tamariki Ora / Well Child nursing. Explore literature that is relevant to the way that health is explained in the New Zealand context and work with clients from their own perspective/world view. Focus on service delivery that promotes culturally safe care and supports individuals, whānau and communities to increase their skills in health-focused daily living.	60
HSC8501: Primary Health Care and Health Promotion This course will enable you to gain an in-depth understanding of primary health care, community practice and health promotion. You will explore the theory and policy that influences practice, with a focus on evidence-based practice, community development, population health, the application of Te Tiriti o Waitangi to primary healthcare, and health literacy.	60

This 90 credit two course qualification offers a range of courses which allows for a programme of study that best meets your needs and reflects current and developing research-based practice in relation to health care delivery.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Domestic: Registered health professional/ counsellor, NZ practising certificate (or equivalent), Bachelor degree (or equivalent) and employed in a relevant clinical service for a minimum of three days (22.5 hours) per week.
- International: IELTS 6.5 with no band lower than 6.

HSC8607: Advanced Paramedic Practice 1 45 credits

This course offers Intermediate Life Support (ILS) Paramedics (or equivalent) the opportunity to develop skills and knowledge at Advanced Life Support (ALS) Levels. The purpose is to expand your ability to relate key concepts of advanced airway care and advanced management of a range of medical conditions to pre-hospital emergency care. You will critically analyse your practice in your own clinical setting to develop the ability to provide patient care that is clinically and professionally appropriate to that setting. A strong focus of the course is on the development of clinical leadership through research and scholarship.

HSC8608: Advanced Paramedic Practice 2 45 credits

This course offers Intermediate Life Support (ILS) Paramedics (or equivalent) the opportunity to develop skills and knowledge at Advanced Life Support (ALS) Levels. This course will expand your ability to relate key concepts of resuscitation and advanced management of cardiac and trauma conditions to pre-hospital emergency care. You will critically analyse your practice in your own clinical setting to develop the ability to provide patient care that is clinically and professionally appropriate to that setting. A strong focus of the course is on the development of clinical leadership through research and scholarship.

HSC8614: Urgent Community Care Practice 1 45 credits

In this course you will explore models and components of the evaluation of patient need in the urgent community health care setting. The purpose is to expand and enhance your range of initial presentation assessment and diagnostic skills, and develop an understanding of contextualised models of urgent community health care and their evidence base. You will critically analyse your practice in your own clinical setting to develop the ability to evaluate patient need that is clinically and professionally appropriate to that setting.

HSC8615: Urgent Community Care Practice 2 45 credits

In this course you will explore models and components of clinical judgment and referral in the urgent community health care setting. Clinically, the purpose is to expand and enhance your range of initial presentation management and referral skills. Conceptually, you will relate developments in urgent community health care and evidenced based practice to their communities. You will critically analyse your practice in your own clinical setting to develop the ability to manage and refer that is clinically and professionally appropriate to that setting.

HSC8705: Praxis in Gerontology

45 Credits

In this postgraduate course the students will have the opportunity to advance their knowledge and clinical capacity in specialty gerontology practice for person-centred care. Students will critically examine the broader perspectives and issues related to population aging applied to advanced gerontology practice. Students will develop skills to become influencers in quality improvement for service delivery in the socio-political context of Aotearoa New Zealand.

HSC8611: Pacific Health 45 credits

In this course you will explore the concepts of specialty knowledge and understanding of Pacific healthcare within a holistic framework. The purpose is to expand your ability to relate key concepts of Pacific health care and evidenced based practice to your communities. You will explore your own understanding of self and others and the impact that they can make to the health outcomes for Pacific peoples within the New Zealand context.

HSC8602: Clinical Leadership

In this course you will explore the concepts of quality assurance and evidence-based practice. These will then be examined against current standards of practice within your area of employment. This course also assists you to develop your potential to become clinical leaders within a workforce with increased specialty knowledge of health care.

HSC8701: The Foundation of Palliative Care 45 credits

This course provides foundation knowledge and understanding of palliative care within a holistic framework and will enable you to extend your knowledge in relation to the care of the patient, family and whānau living with a terminal illness. It introduces you to relevant theory, research and critical reflection that is deemed essential to palliative care practice. You will explore your understanding of self and others across the lifespan and the impact that an advanced cancer or other terminal illness may have on the patient, family and whānau, both during the patient's illness and/ or during bereavement.

HSC8702: Praxis in Palliative Care 45 credits

This course develops praxis as you apply theory, research and critical reflection to palliative care provision across a variety of settings. Quality improvement and evidence-based practice within your own work environment will be examined against palliative care standards and policy. This course also supports you to examine your contribution to inter-professional practice and clinical leadership.

HSC8703: The Foundations of Specialty Nursing 45 credits

Extend your knowledge and skills to assess and manage clinical situations in the context of increasing complexity in acute care and perioperative practice. Normal physiology, pathological processes, the impact of surgical interventions and an individual's response, including the adaptation to chronic health issues, are explored. There is a focus on evidence-based practice as the foundation for high quality service delivery in response to patients' clinical needs and to provide support for patients and their family/whānau. Exploring the contribution of research to practice and the use of critical reflection further develop professional expertise, competency and valid knowledge.

HSC8704: Praxis in Perioperative Specialty Nursing 45 credits

Demonstrate advancing practice knowledge and skill in perioperative nursing. By focusing on the perioperative period, this course is designed to extend your assessment skills for enhanced clinical judgment in recognising deviations from normal and managing complications of acute medical/ surgical interventions as well as providing client centered care beyond routine practice, embracing the increasing complexity consistent with contemporary practice. The content further develops praxis through the utilisation of research, quality improvement and clinical leadership.

HSC8603: Forensic Practice

45 credits

This course will provide you with the opportunity to critically examine forensic practice, holistic assessment, resiliency and leadership. You will develop the skills and knowledge to work with people who present to mental health and criminal justice services. This will expand your ability to relate the complexities of mental health and addictions with prevention, early intervention, responsivity and desistance.

HSC8605: Primary Mental Health Care 45 credits

This course offers you specialty knowledge and understanding of primary mental health care within a holistic framework. The purpose is to expand your ability to relate models of care and key concepts of recovery focused mental health care to your primary care setting, while developing advanced assessment and decision making skills. You will explore your own understanding of self and others, and inter-sectorial care, and the impact that they make on the health outcomes of people experiencing mental illness in primary health care.
